## Plans for spending 2024-25

- **To promote exercise and healthy lifestyles**- SCARF resources, Sports coach, Sports week, external clubs
- **To raise standards in PE and school sport** – Continue with our sports coach who has the knowledge and expertise to really challenge our pupils and develop standards throughout the school. Engage in the tennis academy and with Witney rugby club, dance academy.
- **To develop an outstanding PE curriculum** - All teachers to receive and access CPD with REAL P.E- through CREATE bespoke training and staff meetings
- **To develop outstanding teaching of PE and sport throughout the school**– use of (WSP) to work alongside teachers according to audit of needs, develop sports vision with staff
- **To increase participation in exercise and sporting activities** – lunchtime activities, playleader programme and after school clubs – broad range and targeting different audiences. To take in a Christian dance workshop
- **To listen to children's feedback on events** – Children asked to provide feedback on sporting events, opportunities equipment and act accordingly
- **To identify, celebrate and nurture sporting talent** –medals for sporting events e.g. House Cross Country, sports day and school games day.
- **Grow links with local clubs** – To work closely with local clubs to promote Active60 outside of school. Rugby, hockey, football, tennis, dance.
- **To identify and offer additional support in physical development for those who need it** - pay for additional swimming lesson for pupils in Y5/6 who have not yet met the NC requirements Training for Nursery if available
- **To increase opportunities for all pupils to take part in internal and external sporting competitions, tournaments, events and performances** – Plan and run House Competitions – rounders, cross country. Planning time for all children in KS2 to represent the school in external sporting competitions
- **To use sport as an opportunity to promote the idea of team and community and to strengthen personal character and develop values** – continue to use House Flags for sporting events and have opening ceremonies
- **To increase participation in exercise and physical activities**- Ensure every child everyday takes part in physical activity- 5 minute daily workout, super movers, brain breaks, active playtimes and lunchtimes, broad range of afterschool clubs to attract more children to achieve the target of 60 active minutes everyday
- **To develop outstanding teaching of PE and sport throughout the school**– whole staff training Create Development, Jasmine licence, staff meeting to ensure staff are confident teaching fundamental skills and assessing children's development.
