

Sport Funding Premium Report 2019-20

Aston & Cote CE Primary School

Our aims:

In 2019-20 the school received £17,282. Below is a breakdown of expenditure and impact.

Regular sports features in the newsletter; sports display board and display books	All children Admin Costs for Sports Coach to collate: £1100	Pupils and parents are informed about the sporting opportunities available to them in school. There is a high profile of sport in the school. We place high importance and value upon this. Pupils have a minimum of 2 hours access to PE lessons a week as well as 2 lunchtime and 3 after school sporting clubs. Pupils look at the board regularly for updates and are asked for ideas and feedback.
Part funded partnership sports coordinator; TA overtime and some subsidy of transport costs	Most pupils in the school have taken part in at least one event Transport Teacher & TA overtime - £750 Sports coach overtime - £350	We have been able to take part in a wide range of interschool tournaments, events and competitions Pupils are proud and happy when they have certificates for participation and for winning if competition – these are given out in assembly. Character building – bonding as a team and learning core values for life. Opportunities for those with sporting talent to shine. Also, opportunities for those who would not normally take part to take part – building confidence, teamwork skills and a sense of community. We have a good level of participation in the Witney partnership sporting events for a small school
We employed a qualified sports coach for lunchtime and after school clubs	All pupils £2900	Increased professional expertise within the school – Sam our sports coach is very well qualified in his field. This has raised standards of PE lessons and extra-curricular sport offered. There are increased opportunities for pupils to participate in sport – at lunchtime and after school 2019-20 - 100% of pupils in Year 6 achieved the standard expected for the National curriculum. Sports Day	Release time to plan a successful virtual Sports day and collate videos/photos and points £200 Resources £50	Children and their families took part in a very successful virtual sports day. Awards were sent to the children's homes; house points were given out and we celebrated the winning house. Increased opportunities for pupils and their families to participate in sport.
Rounders equipment	£80	Enable access to high quality equipment. Opportunity for exceptional sports pupils to shine. Learning new skills and rules to follow. A whole school house competition took place Summer 2019 involving all children who competed for their houses. The children loved taking part in competitive sport.
Sports partnership co-ordinator	£1,316	Increased opportunities for all pupils to take part in external sporting competitions, tournaments and events.
Cricket Coach	£340	The cricket coach had the knowledge and expertise to really challenge our pupils and develop standards throughout the school.
Large climbing and physical development equipment	£900	After initial baselines of the children's physical literacy we found a real need for gross motor movement and upper body strength to be increased. The climbing equipment and scrabble tunnel/hill was installed to promote the development of both of these needs. Total cost £8934- majority in 2018/19, £900 used from the 2019/20 sports premium funding.
Pom Pom Club	£150	A set of Pom Poms purchased for an after-school club to encourage activity and movement
For the third time we have been awarded the GOLD kite mark for School Games.		

Plans for spending 2020-2021 – we will receive £17 270 this year

- **To promote exercise and healthy lifestyles** – P.E storage to ensure all equipment is stored effectively and maintained to a good standard.
- **To raise standards in PE and school sport** – Sport coach who has the knowledge and expertise to really challenge our pupils and develop standards throughout the school. Engage in the tennis academy and with Witney rugby club.
- **To develop an outstanding PE curriculum** – subscribe to REAL P.E (£495 if we upgrade, email sent by Sam 11/06/20), Play, Dance, Gym and Leaders
- **To develop outstanding teaching of PE and sport throughout the school**– use of Sue (WSP) to work alongside teachers according to audit of needs, develop sports vision with staff, Buy Jasmine licence (£250) so staff can accurately assess children's physical literacy and move their development forward.– why sport, outstanding PE lessons; EYFS physical development training for Windmill and preschool if possible
- **To increase participation in exercise and sporting activities** - lunchtime and after school clubs – wide range and targeting different audiences. Some clubs FOC
 - Develop the Aston 5-minute workout
 - Training of staff to promote exercise as a means to improve mental well-being
- **To identify, celebrate and nurture sporting talent** – enamel sporting badges? medals for sporting events e.g. House Cross Country. Links with external clubs (specialised coaching to develop teachers and children).
- **To identify and offer additional support in physical development for those who need it** - pay for additional swimming lesson for pupils in Y5/6 who have not yet met the NC requirements;

- **To increase opportunities for all pupils to take part in internal and external sporting competitions, tournaments, events and performances** – Transport to and from external sporting events so all children are able to attend. Run House Competitions – rounders, cross country, orienteering
- **To use sport as an opportunity to promote the idea of team and community and to strengthen personal character and develop values** – continue to use House Flags for sporting events and have opening ceremonies- continue with high-quality in-house sporting events (School sports leaders + Sports coach to plan and lead).
- **To increase participation in exercise and physical activities-** Further develop 5-minute workout and active lessons- investigate purchasing an active lessons subscription
- **To develop outstanding teaching of PE and sport throughout the school**– whole staff training inset with Create Development (**whole school programme in 2018 was £1,795**).
